## Key Features of the Shower Bootie:

- The Shower Bootie enables the user to Collect 100% of the water dispensed during the shower's warm up cycle
  - Channels the Wide angle spray down to a single output port that drains into the containment device (Bucket, etc.)
  - The Output capacity of the Shower Bootie is 2-2.5x greater than the input volume of water.
- The Shower Bootie Adapts easily to any size and shape shower head.
- No Tools required
- Installs and removes in Seconds
- Inexpensive, Simple and Easy to use.
- Built in the **USA**, Patent Pending



## Impact of Warm Up Water Waste:

- Using an average number of household residents at 3-4, and an average shower warmup cycles of 3 times per day, the water wasted down the drain averages 5-7gals /day, or 2000-2500gals/yr. Per Household..
- With the Sacramento County Population of ~1.4mil, That can average 3.5 mil gallons /yr
- Throughout California this can average 80-120 mil gal/day of water down the drain.
- All this water can be re-purposed for anything that the user would normally turn on the faucet to supply that need.

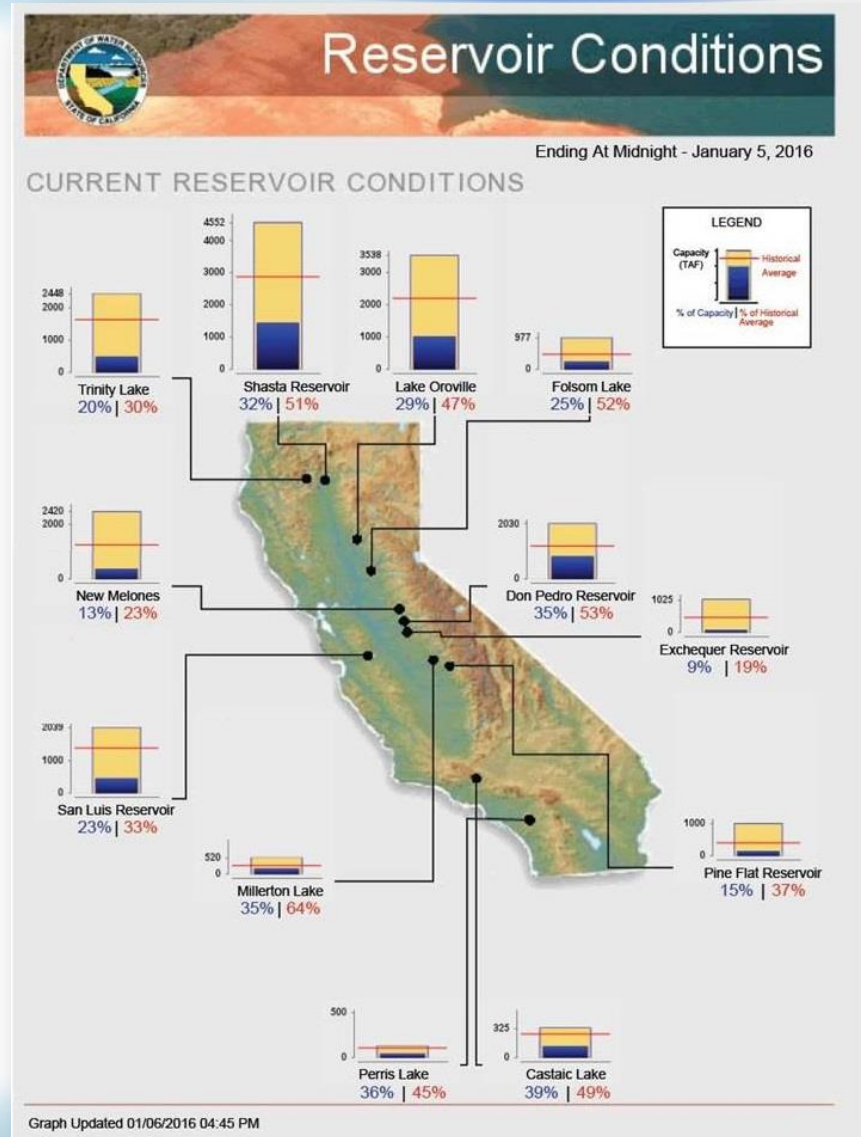


## My Survey Results :

- Surveyed ~160 Sacramento County Residents
- ~72% of those surveyed either use or did use a bucket in their shower to collect water.
- Typical response:
  - “Is not efficient unless you hold the bucket up to the shower head”.
  - “Weight of the water becomes an issue” as well as the time it takes.
  - “Ultimately either stop using or place the bucket on the floor where it barely makes it worth the effort.”

## Current Water Status:

- **None** of our Reservoirs in Calif are yet at their historical average volume.
- Ground Water is at an all time low
- While the snow fall has been good and steady, what's critical is the water content. The drier the snow, the less water in it.
- Conservation is still needed throughout the year an quite possibly "Years" to ensure that we are out of the Red.
