MEETING SUMMARY

- Presentation topics included: RDCP purpose, goals, scope, schedule, and milestones; Task Force roles and responsibilities; and next steps. Hard copies of the presentation slides and draft Work Plan were distributed as materials.
- Task Force member questions:
 - Who is on the task force? [Answer: The 5 water agencies with Reclamation water service and settlement contracts, the 12 water agencies in the North American Basin, RWA, Water Forum, DWR, and Reclamation.]

- What will the communication and outreach involve? [Answer: The Communication and Outreach Plan will be a succinct document describing with whom we intend to engage during RDCP development, how to reach out to them, and when (at which milestones). We intend to leverage existing efforts and venues, whenever possible. As an example, Task Force meetings will be open to the public, and the meeting that includes presentation of the draft RDCP and process for providing comments will be available via Webinar to allow remote viewing/participation.]
- When are the Task Force meetings held? [Answer: When held, Task Force meetings are anticipated to follow Water Caucus meetings on the second Wednesday of the month. Task Force meetings will be as needed, and not necessarily monthly.]
