5.0 Program Updates	
SMUD Partnership Pilot Program	The RWA's Water Efficiency Program (WEP) is partnering with SMUD on their marketplace incentive pilot program. WEP will contribute \$2,000 towards showerheads and aerators for the pilot program. The program is an online Electric and Water Saving Portal. Low income customers will be able to "purchase" the product (showerhead, etc.) they are interested in and it will be shipped to them at no cost. Marketing will be conducted via billboards, on buses, and on the SMUD website. Multiple languages will be used in the marketing of the program. Each household will receive a
	personalized code, which will allow activity (purchases) within the program to be tracked. It is currently unknown how the program will be received by customers. If the demand is high, SMUD will move some incentive funds from electric to water. RWA may look for grant funding for the program.

EcoLandscape	Marian Bender, Executive Director, presented on all the activities conducted by
Partnership	EcoLandscape and the incipient merger of EcoLandscape and ReScape California.
	The merger sounds like a positive change for both organizations. ReScape has sample language to incorporate their program graduates into City and County contracts and
	Requests For Qualifications (RFQs). ReScape also have extensive training for professional landscapers. EcoLandscape has an annual conference for professionals.
	The WEP budget has allocated \$5,000 towards the Ecolandscaper Training Program (previously Green Gardner Training) and \$5,000 towards resident focused workshops. After much debate, it was decided WEP will fund the \$5,000 towards EcoLandscaper training Program and we will wait to see the results of the merger prior to providing any additional funding.
