3.0 WEP Budget Recommendations

The Ad Hoc Finance Committee provided the following recommendations:

Maintain some level of RWA share/transfer of funding from RWA to WEP budget preferably a minimum of 20%. This is important to maintain the level of services. Program dues will likely need to increase in the future to maintain a balanced budget.

Reserves are used for floating grant expenses/reimbursement, emergency expenses, program design changes, and drought related activities. Recommended reserve funding changes: \$150,000 for grant floating; \$100,000 for program; \$50,000 for drought/program redesign. Review reserve funding on an annual basis to ensure the program is staying within recommended changes.

Next steps include an internal meeting to discuss RWA share and Reserve amount with RWA staff. Recommendations will be presented to the RWA Board for official approval and inclusion in RWA policy.

4.0 Group Discussion	
Drought Messaging	On May 13, 2021, RWA approved a drought related Resolution focused on environmental (reference to conditions on the lower American River) and supply needs of the region and requested a 10% voluntary reduction from suppliers.
	On July 8, 2021, the Governor issued an Executive Order calling for voluntary water conservation efforts of 15% and monthly reporting to track the savings compared to 2020 usage. RWA has a special board meeting scheduled on July 15, 2021, with a proposed resolution to adopt a 20% voluntary reduction.
	WEP messaging is focusing on outdoor water use and leaks. Funding from previous grants is

water saving tips during prime time. The watering map on BeWaterSmart.info is updated regularly and Proposition 1 funding is available for residential and commercial rebates
including irrigation efficiencies, turf removal, and water loss.
