2.0 Meeting Notes The	e January 11, 2022 notes were approved and will be posted online.
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Dues will remain the same as last year. Reserves will be used to supplement the program at
current level. RWA budget salary share has resulted in RWA contributing towards the WEP
budget from 2016-2020. There was no RWA budget salary share contribution last year. RWA
is planning on a contribution of \$56,000 (20%) in this fiscal year. The WEP budget will need
adjustments if RWA doesn't approve the budget salary transfer for this year and the school
education program may need to be altered during the next fiscal year depending on
developing opportunities. Updates will be presented at the next RWEPAC meeting. Water
coordinators requested an ad hoc committee/standalone meeting to discuss the budget.

Agencies will need to create landscape budgets for all current dedicated irrigation/landscap
metered (DIM) accounts. This will include taking the total square footage of landscape area
for each DIM account and applying the landscape budget calculation from DWR. Then the
calculated landscape budgets will be compared to actual meter data on an annual basis and
reported to the state. Landscape area measurement is a supplier's responsibility.
Mixed metered accounts with one acre of landscape area or more will need to be converte
to a DIM meter or will need to adopt an alternative to DIM metering (DWR is defining
alternative options).

5.0 State Water Board SB 606/AB 1668 Target Calculator Overview	
	The calculator provides a high-level assessment of a supplier's potential compliance with the indoor and outdoor SB 606/AB 1668 draft target budgets. Use this tool with caution as it does not account for data irregularities (based on electric annual report data and preliminary DWR landscape area data) and does not include water loss and CII budget targets.

6.0 General Program and	d Drought Updates
Water Spots Video Contest	The deadline for video submissions is March 11 <sup>th</sup> .
Focus Groups	Two focus groups will be held this year. The English focus group will focus on trees and general landscape behavior. The Sacramento Tree Foundation is providing feedback on draft focus group questions. The Spanish focus group will focus on the same questions as the English sessions with the addition of more general questions like "where do you go to find watering guidelines?" and "how do you know when to water your landscape?".
Water Loss Regulation	This is currently on a holding pattern but is expected to be adopted mid year.
<b>Outdoor Regulation</b>	This will be transitioning from DWR to SWB in the near future.
Indoor Regulation	There is a current proposal to change indoor usage from 55 to 42 by 2030.
Drought Messaging	The drought toolkit is available with newsletter template text, social media posts, customizable advertisements and more! The Public Outreach PIO meeting is scheduled for March 22, 2022 to discuss drought messaging in more detail.
