Budget Process

- Essentially 3 rounds of the budget were passed
 - 1st to meet the constitutional deadline of June 15th
 - 2nd created the larger structure of the budget with some appropriations (late June)
 - 3rd final appropriations specified

Climate and Water Resources Numbers



- Total of \$4 billion for Climate split between Drought, Energy, Wildfire, Extreme Heat, Nature Based Solutions
- \$160.5 million for watershed climate resilience (split between upper and lower watershed)
- \$116 million for Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) implementation
- \$150 million for conservation and turf replacement
- \$100's of millions for Voluntary Agreements

Specifics on Watershed Climate Resilience



Lower watershed at DWR. This year \$66.5 million with an additional \$84 million in the out years for a total of \$150.5 million.

AB 179 Sec 19.58

- "(i) These funds shall be provided as grants to water agencies and other public agencies for <u>drought resilience</u> and identification and assessment of climate risks on a watershed basis.
- (ii) These funds shall be prioritized in areas with greatest risk or potential to reduce environmental conflicts. Funds may be used for longer-term planning and resilience projects, including but not limited to... <u>infrastructure to improve regional flexibility to address drought conditions</u>, and conjunctive use and management between multiple water supply sources."

Specifics on Watershed Climate Resilience Cont'



- \$93 million Upper Watershed to the WCB this year
- Additional \$80 million in out years for a total of \$173 million.
- These funds shall support competitive grants to improve watershed protection and climate resiliency
