


Wednesday, October 26, 2022, 6 to 8 p.m.

The Regional Water Authority (RWA) is launching a public engagement process for the Sacramento Regional Water Bank, an innovative groundwater storage program utilizing the expansive reservoir under the urban core for storing water during wet times for use during dry times.



The goal of the Water Bank public engagement process is to share information, answer questions and gather input about how a Water Bank could be operated and expanded in the Sacramento region.

RWA is planning several public meetings—called Stakeholder Forums—over the next 15 months with the first Stakeholder Forum scheduled for **Wednesday**, **October 26**, **2022**, **from 6 to 8 p.m.** Key topic areas at the first Forum are expected to include:

- Water sources and management in the Sacramento region
- Projected impacts of climate change on the region's water resources
- How water banking works
- How a Water Bank could help the region adapt to climate change
