2. Public Comment

3. Approval of previous meeting minutes

Approval of the minutes from the August 31, 2022 RWA Federal Affairs Standing Committee Meeting.

4. Disclosures and Regional Coordination

Mr. Peifer mentioned that the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation released the American River Basin Study that identifies future climate and hydrology projections and outlines gaps between water supplies and projected urban and agricultural demands in the American River Basin. The study describes regional vulnerabilities and strategies for adaption designed to address climate vulnerabilities in the American River watershed.

5. Federal Legislation Review

- a) USEPA published PFAS CERCLA proposed rulemaking, the proposed rulemaking process has a November 7 deadline for public comment. This issue is expected to be heavily litigated. There will also possibly be a rule introduced on cyber security mandates that would affect local water agencies. There was discussion on the Inflation Reduction Act and the Water Smart Program. Most of the funding will go to current Water Supply Programs.
- b) Mr. Dickson said that the Federal FY23 Budget will likely require a Continuing Resolution through December 16.
- c) Mr. Sapirstein gave an update on the waivers for the Build America, Buy America Mandate, a letter was sent to the White House with a cc to Radika Fox requesting a 2 year waiver for the water sector.
- d) There was no update at this time on the Section 219 Work Group.

6. Water Bank & MOA Update

Ms. Banonis said that Reclamation is waiting for some policy guidance to determine feasibility. There was no further update at this time.
