3.0 Sacramento Suburban Water District Host Presentation, Presentation by Greg Bundesen

AB 1572 and AB 1573 (Friedman) were discussed. The current focus is on AB 1572 which includes defining nonfunctional turf, the inclusion of CII and multifamily customers, a customer certification processes, tiered implementation timeframe, and state and local enforcement options. AB 1573 is still in development but expected to focus more on increasing native plants in landscapes but will still contain an nonfunctional turf definition. RWA created a small work group to dive into the non functional turf details such as

RWA created a small work group to dive into the non functional turf details such as enforcement, ensuring 50% living material in replacement landscape materials, tree health variance/exception, DAC property options, and MWELO references. In addition, there has been discussion on relating the development of CA laws to previously established Nevada laws/restrictions.

RWA is coordinating with ACWA on both bills.

Urban Drought Grant	RWA was awarded \$3M from the 2022 Urban Drought Grant including \$2.1M is for DAC direct install, \$340,000 for public outreach, and \$500,000 for turf removal/irrigation efficiencies. This is a 3-year grant. Program Agreements will be distributed in the future.	
WEP Dues Increase	There was a recommendation to increase WEP dues by 3%. This will be the first dues increase since 2017. RWA will not be increasing their dues for FY2023/2024. This will be discussed further at the May meeting.	
RWA is Moving	The RWA office is moving to 2295 Gateway Oaks Drive, Sacramento. The current lease expires in August 2023. There will be a conference room available to host meetings. Large meetings will need to be held at a different location.

WaterSense Awards application deadline extended to March 31st. RWA Indoor and Outdoor Studies are ongoing with summer release of draft data. RWA is looking into two new potential CIMIS sites in the Lincoln/Auburn and Elk Grove/Unincorporated Sacramento County areas. We will send site recommendations to DWR for consideration. Thank you to the city of Roseville for assisting in this effort. BEF CII Outdoor Rebate Report will be released on AWE website in May. Joanna Solins, Environmental Horticulture Advisor, UC Cooperative Extension, is soliciting potential workshop ideas. Ideas included: learning about other agency programs; cooling tower programs; calculating GPCD; and Prop 218. WSI Conference will be held October 3-5th in Las Vegas. Abstract acceptance will be sent by May 2023. Water Spots Video Contest video submissions review this Friday! Less videos this year. We need to evaluate continuing the contest in the future. River Cats/Sac Republic Partnership exploration/negotiation is ongoing. River Cats were purchased by the Sacramento Kings and partnership costs have increased. Next Steps	There will be a ramp up of 606/1668 related meeting in 2023 hosted by the State Water Board, which will be focused on residential outdoor, CII DIM and CI performance measures. The State Water Board is looking for new suppliers to comment and attend these meetings. We will be forwarding out meeting invites to everyone. We expect the upcoming State Water Board recommendations to be more stringent than DWR's October 2022 recommendations.

Supplier staff will handle communicating regulation details to management.
Reporting timeline	Suppliers will calculate their first budget and submit accompanying meter data by January 1, 2024, according to the legislation text below. Suppliers can use data from 2023 calendar year or 2022/2023 fiscal year.
	Per WC Sections 10609.20 and 10609.22, an urban retail water supplier is required to calculate its UWUO and actual water use for the prior year no later than January 1, 2024, and by January 1 every year thereafter. These calculations are to be based on the urban retail water supplier's water use conditions for the previous calendar or fiscal year.
