

Water Bank - Project Benefits and Outcomes



Federal Acknowledgement

Enables (1) any CVP contract supply to be banked outside the service area of that contractor, and (1) recovery of that supply by CVP and non-CVP contractors

Environmental Compliance

Through CEQA and NEPA documents, evaluates (1) expansion of existing conjunctive use, and (2) Reclamation acknowledgement of Water Bank

Water Accounting System

Accommodates multiple accounts that support all participating agencies and GSAs

External Partners

Through pilot opportunities, establishes relationships and develops institutional knowledge with external partners

Supports securing long-term agreements that provide consistent and reliable benefits to the region

Surface Water/ Groundwater Interaction

Advances science and understanding of both accretion and depletions associated with water banking operations

Financial Agreements

Develops framework to encourage broad, active, and beneficial implementation of conjunctive use by all participating agencies




Project Description—Elements

The Project includes the following elements:

- Coordinate and expand the conjunctive use practices of Participating Agencies and establish governance and other protocols to conduct a regional groundwater banking program.
- Annual recharge of up to 65,000 acre-feet during wet conditions, and annual recovery of up to 55,000 acre-feet during dry conditions.
- <u>Establish a Water Accounting System</u> to track groundwater recharge (deposits) and extraction (withdrawals) to ensure proper and transparent accounting of banked balances.

As separate future action under the NEPA, it is anticipated that RWA will seek approval of the Project as an acknowledged facility for the banking of CVP water by Reclamation.

Sacramento Regional Water Bank Development Project - Funding Status Update (February 19, 2024)

Purpose of Document

This memorandum provides an update on the status of the Sacramento Regional Water Bank (i.e. Water Bank) development project budget AND provides additional details on a federal funding request to increase the project budget.

This memorandum is being provided to the Program Committee in part for informational purposes, but to convey details of the federal funding request that will be discussed at the upcoming February 21, 2024 Program Committee meeting. During this meeting, RWA staff will be asking for Program Committee support to bring the federal funding request to the RWA Board of Directors on March 14, 2024 for consideration and approval to submit to the United States Bureau of Reclamation (USBR). In additional during the February 21, 2024 Program Committee meeting, RWA staff will be asking for direction and guidance on projected budget shortfall projections. The projected budget shortfall amount is dependent on the successful approval of the federal funding request and the USBRs support for in-kind contribution.

RWA appreciates feedback on this subject in an effort to maintain adequate funding to continue project implementation. RWA provided updates on the status on Water Bank project funding at the May 4 and July 6, 2023, Program Committee meetings. In addition, RWA developed a prior Project Funding Status Update memorandum dated July 14, 2023 that provided the Program Committee with details as to the current and projected status of the multiple sources of Water Bank project funding.

The Appendices of this document includes:

- A summary of current and projected project costs and how existing and potential sources of funding are approximated to meet costs over time (Attachment A). RWA must continue to maintain adequate cash flow in advance of project work.
- An overview of existing Phase 1, 2, and DWR grant funds and opportunities for planned Federal funding (Attachments B, C, & D).

Background

RWA is working on behalf of 22 water agencies in the greater Sacramento region to develop the Water Bank, a conjunctive use water management project that will provide water supply reliability and other related benefits for the region and State of California. Referred to as the Water Bank Program Committee, these agencies are contributing financially to the development of the Water Bank through Phase 1 and 2 agreements. RWA has also obtained Water Bank project funding through a 2022 DWR Drought Grant and intends to seek approval from the RWA Board of Directors to submit an application to the USBR for federal funding.
